## Program Description

Youth engaged in the justice system require varying levels of support depending on the referral source.

For FASD impacted youth in the early stages of justice involvement, individualized case management and family support are essential components to prevent further recidivism.

FASD impacted youth on probation orders, however, may only require additional support in meeting their conditions.

## Eligibility

- Youth between 12-17 years & their Caregivers
- FASD Diagnosis or Strong Query
- Police or Youth Justice Involvement

Service is client-centered & directed with a focus on the strengths & abilities of the individual, with the goal of improving outcomes for FASD impacted youth in the justice system

## Services

### The Youth Worker will:

- Advocate and navigate within justice & other systems
- Support youth in complying with expectations of diversion, judicial orders & conditions
- Access and link youth to community agencies & supports, including housing, developmental services, employment & recreation
- Teach life skills and build good habits that will support daily living

### The Family Support Worker will:

- Refer to community agencies and supports across all sectors
- Support caregivers to follow through with recommendations from service providers
- Assist caregivers to learn and use FASD friendly strategies
- Support caregivers to identify & build upon their teens' strengths
- Assist caregivers querying FASD to pursue formal diagnosis
- Help caregivers explore ways to increase circle of support

Support is offered in the community or virtually during regular business hours or evenings, as needed.  
No fee for service.
